PLEASE NOTE: ALL entries MUST be picked up Sunday, June 12 between 8pm - 10pm (except quilts which will be available for pick up Monday only) or Monday, June 13 between 8am - noon. All entries not picked up will not be held by the Fair and will be donated or disposed of immediately.

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. All [state rules](#) and [local rules](#) apply.
2. All divisions are open to amateurs and professionals unless otherwise stated.
3. Projects made by groups must be entered in classes designated for groups.
4. The American system of judging is used in all classes. All entries are judged on their overall effect, workmanship, technique, and creativity as appropriate to the Division and Class entered.
5. Stained, soiled, unsanitary, or objectionable articles will be refused and returned to exhibitor without being judged or displayed.
6. **EACH EXHIBITOR IS LIMITED TO 2 ENTRIES PER CLASS, except for Collections which is limited to 1 entry per exhibitor.** If an exhibitor has excess entries in a class, the item(s) with the higher entry number(s) will be disqualified.
7. Items must be entered in the class that describes (names) that item. "Other" classes are for items that do not fit in a named class by definition or description. Items that are incorrectly entered may be disqualified.
8. An entry is one (1) item (not sets) unless otherwise specified in division rules. All items that are part of a set must be securely attached together for display.
9. All entries must have been completed by the **individual entrant** within two years of the opening date of the fair. Items determined to have been entered in any previous year's fair will be eliminated from judging and returned to the exhibitor.
10. All items must be sturdy enough to be handled and moved. No special handling possible.
11. All stained glass, paintings, and ceramics/pottery must be entered in the Fine Arts Department. All woodworking must be entered in the STEAM Department.
12. Fiber-based jewelry is permitted in divisions where specified. All other jewelry must be entered in Fine Arts Galleria.
13. Items will only be released during the designated entry release times due to safety and security. Early release is not possible.
14. Challenges are open to groups of four (4) or more individuals. Each group must submit a display board not larger than 9" x 12" explaining the challenge. Each entry must meet the challenge criteria as explained on the display board.

AWARDS:

Awards offered are per class except as noted per division or special awards. Honorable mention ribbons will be given in classes at the discretion of the Department Supervisor and Judges.

SEWING

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 600 - 601

- 1st Place \$20 Ribbon
- 2nd Place Ribbon
- 3rd Place Ribbon

RULES:

1. Items must be sewn by entrant. No ready-to-wear items permitted. All embellished ready-to-wear items must be entered in Division 640.
2. Items must have exhibitor's identification affixed to inside.
3. Entries in Recycled/Up-cycled classes must be made from at least 70% recycled materials.
4. Sewn fabric jewelry is permitted in Div 600 Class 7 & Class 8. Must be primarily fabric. Item must be securely attached to a display board.

DIVISION 600 – SEWN CLOTHING & WEARABLE ACCESSORIES

CLASS:

1. Adult Garment, single item, including sleepwear & outerwear.
2. Child's Garment, single item, including outerwear & sleepwear.
3. Ensemble, adult or child's - 2 - 4 pieces of an outfit.
4. Costume/Cos-Play — adult or child's — up to 4 related pieces allowed.
5. Recycled/Up-cycled Garment.
6. Bag/Purse (totes and utility bags should be entered in 601-7).
7. Other accessory – apron, hat, pair of shoes, jewelry etc.– specify.
8. Recycled/Up-cycled Accessory, including bag.

DIVISION 601 - SEWN NON-CLOTHING

Quilts and quilted wall hangings must be entered in Divisions 620-626.

CLASS:

1. Pillow - any technique.
2. Pillowcase.
3. Pot holder.
4. Table accessories – place mats, napkins, table runner, etc. Sets permitted – must be securely attached.
5. Sewn, dressed doll – entrant –made doll and outfit are judged as a whole.
6. Sewn doll garment or accessory – ensembles permitted (no more than 4 ATTACHED pieces) Note: Doll is not judged.
7. Utility bag/tote.
8. Any other, including sewn toy, tree skirt, stocking, etc.- specify.
9. Recycled/Upcycled Sewn Non-clothing Item.

TEXTILES

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 610 - 612

DIVISION 610 – SPECIALTY TEXTILES

RULES:

1. Indicate yarn contents, ply and intended use on a small label.
2. Include a small sample of pre-spun fiber.
3. Lace/woven jewelry is permitted — must be primarily fiber.

CLASS:

1. Lace Making, including bobbin lace and tatting.
2. Hand Spun Yarn Skein – must contain at least 20 yards. Include a small sample showing how yarn would be used.
3. Article made of **hand** spun yarn – must be made and spun by the entrant. Include a small sample of the yarn used. (1 yard minimum)
4. Weaving.

DIVISION 611 – KNITTED ITEM

RULES:

1. Knitted jewelry is permitted – must be primarily fiber. Item must be securely attached to a display board.
2. Please specify type of fiber used on a small, attached label.

CLASS:

1. Apparel: Children's Garment – sets permitted (ie sweater, booties & hat). Must be securely attached.
2. Apparel: Adult Garment.
3. Apparel: Scarf/Cowl, no wider than 12".
4. Apparel: Shawl/Wrap, wider than 12".
5. Apparel: Hat.
6. Apparel: Child or Adult Accessory – bag, socks, etc.
7. Non-Apparel: Afghan/blanket, any size.
8. Non-Apparel: Toy/doll/doll accessory.
9. Non-Apparel: Household item – potholder, dishcloth, etc.
10. Other, including knitted jewelry. Sets are permitted; all elements must be securely attached.



DIVISION 612 - CROCHETED ITEM

RULE:

Crocheted jewelry is permitted – must be primarily fiber. Item must be securely attached to a display board.

CLASS:

1. Apparel: Children's Garment – sets permitted (ie sweater, booties & hat). Must be securely attached.
2. Apparel: Adult Garment.
3. Apparel: Shawl/Wrap/scarf/cowl.
4. Apparel: Child or Adult Accessory – bag, hat, socks, etc.
5. Non-Apparel: Afghan/blanket – Large, longer than 48".
6. Non-Apparel: Afghan/blanket – Small, no longer than 48".
7. Non-Apparel: Toy/doll/doll accessory.
8. Non-Apparel: Tablecloth or Doily.
9. Other, including crocheted jewelry and holiday items. Sets are permitted; all elements must be securely attached.

QUILTS

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 620 - 624

RULES:

1. All quilts must be entirely constructed and quilted by the individual entrant, except in Divisions 620, 621, 622.
2. **ALL QUILTS MUST HAVE A 4" HANGING SLEEVE.** (A tube sewn to the top of the quilt back). Quilts without sleeves cannot be hung.
3. Any quilt which was quilted using computerized methods or a combination of computerized & hand-guided **MUST** be entered in the "computerized quilting" class, if available in an appropriate division. **Computerized quilting** - quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the Statler Stitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
4. Quilted accessories, such as table runners, tree skirts, bags, etc., must be entered in divisions 600 and 601.
5. **IT IS THE QUILTER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ACCURATELY MEASURE, DETERMINE PERIMETER AND ENTER IN THE APPROPRIATE DIVISION AND CLASS. INCORRECTLY ENTERED ITEMS ARE INELIGIBLE FOR PRIZES! (With nearly 400 quilts entered, it is impractical/impossible for staff to measure all quilts and change classes. If you need assistance, contact Laura McHugh before entering!!)**
6. Perimeter equals (Width + Length) x 2.
7. No framed or wired items – quilts must be foldable.
8. A quilt must have stitching that joins backing, batting and quilt top.

QUILTS ARE AVAILABLE FOR PICK UP ON MONDAY, JUNE 13 FROM 8am to NOON ONLY

DIVISION 620 – QUILT TOP MADE BY ONE PERSON/PROFESSIONALLY QUILTED BY ANOTHER

RULES:

1. All projects pieced by one individual entrant and quilted by a separate professional quilter **MUST** be entered in this division. **Professional quilter** – a person or business providing quilting services for a fee.

CLASS:

1. Computerized quilting, XX-Large quilt - perimeter 340" or greater – all techniques.
2. Computerized quilting, X-Large quilt - Perimeter 300" - 339" - all techniques.
3. Computerized quilting, Large quilt - perimeter 260" - 299" - all techniques.
4. Computerized quilting, Medium quilt - perimeter 220" - 259" - all techniques.
5. Computerized quilting, Small quilt - perimeter 120" - 219" - all techniques.
6. Computerized Wall Hanging/X-Small quilt - perimeter less than 120" - all techniques.
7. Hand-guided quilting, X-Large quilt - perimeter 340" or greater - all techniques.
8. Hand-guided quilting, Large quilt - perimeter between 280" - 339" - all techniques.
9. Hand-guided quilting, Medium quilt - perimeter between 220"- 279" - all techniques.
10. Hand-guided quilting, Small quilt - perimeter between 120"- 219" - all techniques.
11. Hand-guided quilting, Wall hanging/X-Small quilt - perimeter less than 120" - all techniques.

DIVISION 621 – GROUP QUILTS

RULES:

1. Quilt made by a group of 2 or more people.
2. Groups which include youths must enter the Youth Exhibits Department.
3. Any adult quilting group may enter this class such as **friendship, round robin, or opportunity** quilts.

CLASS:

1. Computerized quilting – any size.
2. Large/X-Large quilt – perimeter 250" or greater.
3. Small/Medium quilt – perimeter less than 250".



DIVISION 622 – QUILT CHALLENGE

RULES:

1. This division is open to groups of 4 or more individuals. A separate class will be created for each challenge group after entries are received. Challenge groups with fewer than 4 entrants will not be judged or displayed.
2. **Each individual must enter separately and specify the group name under entry description.**
3. Each group **MUST** submit a display board no larger than 9" x 12" explaining the challenge when entries are received.
4. Each entry must meet the challenge criteria as explained on the display board.
5. Round robin, friendship, and group quilts should be entered in Division 621.
6. A quilt class is not a quilt challenge.
7. Professionally quilted quilts are permitted in this division.

DIVISION 623 – PIECED QUILT/ MACHINE QUILTED

RULE:

All entries must be entirely completed by **ONE** individual entrant, professional or amateur.

CLASS:

1. Computerized quilting – any size.
2. X-Large quilt – perimeter 320” or greater.
3. Large quilt – perimeter between 250” - 319”.
4. Medium quilt - perimeter between 200”- 249”.
5. Small quilt - perimeter between 120” - 199”.
6. Wall Hanging/Small Quilt - perimeter less than 120”.

DIVISION 624 – SPECIALTY QUILT TECHNIQUES

RULE:

1. All entries must be entirely completed by **ONE** individual entrant, professional or amateur.
2. Art Quilts must be ORIGINAL DESIGN.

CLASS:

1. Turned-edge applique - any size.
2. Raw-edge applique - any size.
3. Wool Applique - any size.
4. Hand-quilted - any size.
5. Wholecloth or stenciled quilt, - any size.
6. Embroidered or embellished quilt- any size.
7. Large Art Quilt - Orig. Design - perimeter 120” or larger.
8. Small Art Quilt - Orig. Design - perimeter less than 120”.

NEEDLEWORK

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 630 - 635

RULES:

1. All entries submitted as wall hangings must have a **hanging wire** on the back.
2. Sets may be entered only in the classes which specify sets permitted.
3. Machine embroidered items must be entered in Division 635.
4. 3-D/ Figural refers to the needlework piece, not the mounting/display.

DIVISION 630 – NEEDLEPOINT

Size is determined by the measurement of the needlework, not the frame and/or mat

CLASS:

1. Small Needlepoint wallhanging, framed or unframed – less than 12” on any side.
2. Large needlepoint wallhanging, framed or unframed – greater than 12” on any side.
3. Pillow or 3-D Figural/free-standing piece (box, figure, ornament etc.).
4. Other – specify.

DIVISION 631 - CROSS STITCH & COUNTED THREAD WORK

Size is determined by the measurement of the needlework, not the frame and/or mat.

Other counted threadwork = Hardanger, Assisi, Drawn/Pulled Work, Blackwork, etc.

CLASS:

1. Wall-hanging, counted cross stitch, framed or unframed SMALL – less than 11” on any side
2. Wall-hanging, counted cross stitch, framed or unframed MEDIUM - between 11” - 18” on any side
3. Wall-hanging, counted cross stitch, framed or unframed LARGE - greater than 18” on any side
4. Wall-hanging, other counted threadwork/combined techniques, framed or unframed - any size
5. Blackwork, framed or unframed - any size
6. Pulled thread work, framed or unframed - any size
7. Article, counted cross stitch (bookmark, ornament, etc.)
8. Article, other counted threadwork/combined techniques

DIVISION 632 – SURFACE EMBROIDERY (not counted)

CLASS:

1. Wall hanging, framed or unframed – any size
2. Pillow or 3-D figural/free-standing item
3. Other techniques (stamped items, temari, stumpwork, silk, goldwork, etc.) - specify. Enter items with combined techniques here.

DIVISION 633 - NEEDLEWORK CHALLENGE

RULES:

1. Create a piece of hand embroidery which incorporates letters, words and/or numbers in some way.
2. Any hand embroidery technique can be used and there are no size requirements.

CLASS:

1. Word Challenge

DIVISION 634 – SMOCKING

RULE:

A Wee Care Gown is a simple sewn & smocked gown intended for donation.

CLASS:

1. Smocked Item
2. Smocked Wee Care Gown

DIVISION 635 - MACHINE EMBROIDERY

CLASS:

1. Machine embroidery on item made by entrant
2. Machine embroidery on other, including ready-made items

ARTS & CRAFTS

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 640 - 643

RULES:

1. All paintings, non-fiber jewelry, ceramics/pottery, and stained glass must be entered in the Fine Arts Department.
2. All woodworking must be entered in the STEAM Department
3. All quilts must be entered in the Quilting Section.
4. Framed items must have a hanging wire.

DIVISION 640 - EMBELLISHED ITEM

The entry will be judged on the design and skill with which the exhibitor used the technique(s) to embellish the ready-made piece.

CLASS:

1. Non-wearable item embellished with paint, stitchery, beadwork or a combination of techniques
2. Wearable item embellished with paint, stitchery, beadwork or a combination of techniques

DIVISION 641 - CULTURAL CRAFTS

Items created by using traditional crafts associated with a particular culture.
Include a 3" x 5" card with brief description.

CLASS:

1. Single decorative item - mask, dream catcher, origami etc.
2. Single item made for use - basket, tool, garment, etc.

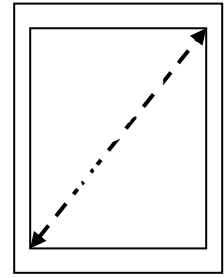
DIVISION 642 - PAPER CRAFTS

RULES:

1. All framed entries **must** have **hanging wire** on back.
2. Size is determined by the measurement of the work, not the frame AND/OR MAT.

CLASS:

1. 3D Paper shadow box, Small – **Diagonal** measurement is less than 9”.
2. 3D Paper shadow box, Medium – **Diagonal** measurement is between 9” and 12”.
3. 3D Paper shadow box, Large – **Diagonal** measurement is greater than 12”.
4. Scrapbooking – provide **TWO ATTACHED**, consecutive pages.
5. Single stationery item, stamped/embossed/embellished, etc. – NO sets.
6. Other paper craft - specify.



DIVISION 643 - OTHER CRAFTS

RULES:

1. Non-fiber jewelry, ceramics/pottery, and stained glass must be entered in the Fine Arts Department.
2. Woodworking must be entered in the Department of Innovation.
3. Paintings must be entered in the Fine Arts Galleria.
4. No sewn items or needlework.
5. Miniature Fairy House must be an original, home-made design and be securely mounted on a 12” or smaller base. Height (including base) must not exceed 18”.
6. Fiber based jewelry must be securely attached to a display board.
7. Embellished, purchased items should be entered in Division 640.

CLASS:

1. Miniature/ Doll House
2. Miniature Fairy House
3. Other craft – specify. Includes items such as: felted items, mosaics, fiber-based jewelry, etc.

Do you collect interesting things like magnets? Coins? Postcards? Bobbins? Would you like to share your interest?

Please note: Collections will be displayed in locking wall cases. Each exhibitor will have the use of one shelf, approximately 35” W x 17” D x 20” H.

No early set-up. Please include the name of the collection on your entry form.

Collections set-up is Thursday, June 2 between 4 PM – 7 PM in the south east corner of Expo Hall. **Collections should be picked up Sunday, June 12 between 8 -10pm or no later than Monday, June 13 between 8am - noon.**

RULES:

1. Individuals and groups may enter. Youth Collections must be entered in Youth Exhibits under Miscellaneous Projects Collections.
2. **ONE ENTRY PER EXHIBITOR.**
3. Items must be owned by exhibitor but need not have been made by the exhibitor. Collection must not have been displayed at this fair within the past five years.
4. Each collection must include an information card or cards no larger than 15” in either dimension.

The card must include: Collection name and Information regarding the exhibit.

Collections will be judged on the following criteria:

- Overall presentation of the display, including background and card.
- Uniqueness and variety of items displayed.
- Informative and/or historical value of the collection as provided on the informational card.

DIVISION 650 - COLLECTIONS

CLASS:

1. Any collection
