ALL entries MUST be picked up between 2 - 7 PM on Monday, June 10^h. All entries not picked up will not be held by the Fair and will be donated or disposed of immediately.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT RULES

- 1. All state rules and local rules apply.
- 2. All divisions are open to amateurs and professionals, unless otherwise stated.
- 3. Projects made by groups must be entered in classes designated for groups. A group is **TWO** or more people.
- 4. The American system of judging is used in all classes. All entries are judged on their overall effect, workmanship, technique, and creativity as appropriate to the Division and Class entered.
- 5. Stained, soiled, unsanitary, or objectionable articles will be refused and returned to exhibitor without being judged or displayed.
- 6. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries per class, except Collections (Div. 650) which is limited to one entry per exhibitor. If an exhibitor has excess entries in a class, item(s) with the higher entry number(s) will be disqualified.
- 7. Items must be entered in the class that describes (names) that item. "Other" classes are for items that do not fit in a named class by definition or description. Items that are incorrectly entered may not be judged.
- 8. An entry is one (1) item (not sets) unless otherwise specified in division rules. All items that are part of a set must be securely attached together for judging and display.
- 9. All entries must have been completed by the entrant within two years of the opening date of the fair. Items determined to have been entered in any previous San Mateo County Fair will be eliminated from judging, not displayed and returned to the entrant.
- 10. All items must be sturdy enough to be handled and moved. No special handling is possible.
- 11. All stained glass, paintings, ceramics/pottery must be entered in the Fine Arts Galleria. All recycled/upcycled clothing made items except quilts and woodworking must be entered into the Department of Innovation.
- 12. Fiber-based jewelry is permitted where specified. All other jewelry must be entered in Fine Arts Galleria.
- 13.Items will only be released during the designated entry release times due to safety and security. Early release is at the discretion of the Department Supervisor.

14. Judging & Awards:

- a. Entries are judged using the American System of Judging entries are judged against each other within classes. There is the availability of one 1st, 2nd, 3rd place. Honorable Mention may be awarded at the discretion of the judge(s). Judges may choose to omit any placing that is believed to be without merit.
- b. All 1st place winners in the seven (7) quilt divisions (620, 621, 622, 623, 624, 625 and 626) compete against each other for the Best of Show Quilt.
- c. Qualified judges are selected by the Fair. Judging decisions are final.
- d. Special awards will be awarded to eligible entries. The Fair does not guarantee the payment of Special Awards, as these premiums are secured in good faith by sponsors.
- e. Awards are offered in each class with at least three qualifying entries.

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 600 - 601

RULES:

- 1. Items must be sewn by the entrant. No ready-to-wear items permitted. All embellished ready-to-wear items must be entered in Division 640.
- 2. Items must have the exhibitor's identification affixed to inside.
- 3. Sewn fabric jewelry is permitted in Div 601 Class 4. Must be primarily fabric. Item must be securely attached to a display board.

DIVISION 600 - SEWN CLOTHING & WEARABLE ACCESSORIES

CLASS:

- 1. Adult Garment
- 2. Child's Garment
- 3. Other accessory apron, hat, pair of shoes specify.

DIVISION 601 - SEWN NON-CLOTHING

NOTE: Quilts and quilted wall hangings must be entered in Divisions 620-626.

- 1. Pillows and pillowcases.
- 2. Kitchen and table accessories potholders, place mats, napkins, table runner, etc. Sets permitted must be securely attached.
- 3. Bag/Purse/Totes and utility bags.
- 4. Any other, including sewn toy, tree skirt, stocking, etc. specify.

DIVISION 610 - SPECIALTY TEXTILES

RULES:

- 1. Indicate yarn contents, ply and intended use on a small label.
- 2. Include a small sample of pre-spun fiber.
- 3. Lace/woven jewelry is permitted must be primarily fiber.

CLASS:

- 1. Handspun Yarn Skein must contain at least 20 yards. Include a small sample showing how yarn would be used.
- 2. Article made of **hand** spun yarn must be made and spun by the entrant. Include a small sample of the yarn used. (1 yard minimum)
- 3. Weaving. Must have a hanging method securely attached.
- 4. Other tatting, etc. please specify

DIVISION 611 - KNITTED ITEM

RULES:

- 1. Knitted jewelry is permitted must be primarily fiber. Item must be securely attached to a display board.
- 2. Please specify type of fiber used on a small, attached label.

CLASS:

- 1. Apparel: Children's Garment sets permitted (ie sweater, booties & hat). Must be securely attached.
- 2. Apparel: Adult Garment.
- 3. Apparel: Scarf/Cowl/Wrap.
- 4. Apparel: Child or Adult Accessory hat/cap, bag, socks, etc.
- 5. Non-Apparel: Afghan/blanket, any size.
- 6. Non-Apparel: Toy/doll/doll accessory.
- 7. Other Non-Apparel: Jewelry, household items potholder, dishcloth, etc.


DIVISION 612 - CROCHETED ITEM

RULES:

- 1. Knitted jewelry is permitted must be primarily fiber. Item must be attached to display board.
- 2. Please specify the type of fiber used on a small, attached label.

- 1. Apparel: Children's Garment sets permitted (e.g, sweater, booties & hat). Must be securely attached.
- 2. Apparel: Adult Garment.
- 3. Apparel: Scarf/Cowl/Wrap
- 4. Apparel: Child or Adult Accessory bag, hat/cap, socks, etc.
- 5. Non-Apparel: Afghan/blanket any size.
- 6. Non-Apparel: Toy/doll/doll accessory.
- 7. Other Non-Apparel: Tablecloth or doily, crocheted jewelry and holiday items.

Each quilt we choose to make, whether we reproduce an antique quilt, make a quilt from a purchased pattern or quilt kit, or creatively wander into new and uncharted territories of original work, the act of creation is how we grow. We end up with something tangible to show for the time and effort we've put into making the quilt. And someday someone may see what we've made and be inspired to make their own version, to add their voice to the narrative that the quilts around us tell.

*In 2024, Division numbers for quilting entries have been updated. Two new Divisions, 620 and 621, are for quilt entries that are original designs. Refer to Rule 9 below for more information on what constitutes an original design.

RULES:

- 1. Quilts must have stitching that joins the backing, batting and top. Stitching can be computerized, machine, hand-quilted or tied. However, please note the limits for various Divisions on the type of quilting allowed for that Division.
- 2. All quilt entries must have a hanging sleeve (4" tube sewn to the top of the quilt back). Quilts without hanging sleeves will be displayed folded in locked showcases, space permitting. Framed or wired quilts will not be accepted for judging or display.
- 3. Divisions are defined to group like quilts together for judging purposes.
- 4. Classes within a Division may be expanded or combined at the discretion of the Department Supervisor. Classes will be combined if there are fewer than three entries in a class. Classes may be created after entries are received, based on the sizes of quilts entered so that there are at least 10, but no fewer than 3 quilts per class.
- 5. Quilts cannot be moved after entry to a different Division. Quilts that do not meet the basic Division description and rules will be displayed, but not judged.
- 6. Quilts may use multiple techniques and thus conform to more than one Division description/rules. Enter quilt in the Division that best describes the Division description. Verification at entry is not conducted; the decision of the judges on conformance to the Division description is final.
- 7. Entrant is for accurately measuring the quilt width for entry in the appropriate class. Incorrectly entered items may not be judged.
- 8. Quilts that exceed 84" in length will be pinned up at the bottom for display.
- 9. Original designs are self-identified by the entrant. For more guidance, refer to https://www.americanquilter.com/design-permissions.
- 10. Quilted accessories, such as table runners, tree skirts, bags, etc., must be entered in Sewing Divisions 600 and 601.
- 11. General quilt judging criteria:
 - Visual Impact
 - Design
 - Workmanship

DIVISION 620 - ORIGINAL QUILT DESIGN PIECED AND QUILTED BY ENTRANT

RULES:

- 1. Pieced and quilted entirely by the entrant entrant's original design. Enter quilts that are based on a purchased pattern, kit or workshop in Divisions 622/623.
- 2. All methods of piecing and other techniques (traditional piecing, foundation paper piecing, applique) except art, recycled/upcycled, tied, puff/yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted, English paper-pieced and whole-cloth quilts. Enter these in Division 625.
- 3. Machine or computerized quilting: Machine: domestic or longarm/sitdown-free motion. Computerized: quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the QMatic, Statler Stitcher, ProStitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
- 4. Hand quilting: using a needle and thread to sew a running stitch by hand across the entire area to be quilted.
- 5. Enter group quilts in Division 624.

- 1. Machine and/or computerized >90" Wide
- 2. Machine and/or computerized 72 to 89" Wide
- 3. Machine and/or computerized 64 to 71" Wide
- 4. Machine and/or computerized Up to 63" Wide
- 5. Hand quilted Any Size

<u>DIVISION 621 – ORIGINAL QUILT DESIGN</u> PIECED BY ENTRANT AND QUILTED BY ANOTHER QUILTER

RULES:

- 1. Pieced by the entrant quilted by another individual, either professional or amateur. Enter quilts that are based on a purchased pattern, kit or workshop in Divisions 622/623.
- 2. Quilter a person or business providing quilting services. Provide the quilter's name on the entry form.
- 3. All methods of piecing and other techniques (traditional piecing, foundation paper piecing, applique) except art, recycled/upcycled, tied, puff/yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted, English paper-pieced and whole-cloth quilts. Enter these in Division 625.
- 4. Machine or computerized quilting: Machine: domestic or longarm/sit-down-free motion. Computerized: quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the QMatic, Statler Stitcher, ProStitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
- 5. Hand quilting: using a needle and thread to sew a running stitch by hand across the entire area to be quilted.
- 6. Specify name of quilter on entry form.
- 7. Enter group quilts in Division 624.

CLASS:

- 1. Machine and/or computerized >90" Wide
- 2. Machine and/or computerized 72 to 89" Wide
- 3. Machine and/or computerized 64 to 71" Wide
- 4. Machine and/or computerized Up to 63" Wide
- 5. Hand quilted Any Size

DIVISION 622 - QUILT PIECED AND QUILTED BY ENTRANT

RULES:

- 1. Pieced and quilted entirely by the entrant. Includes quilts made from kits, purchased patterns and workshops.
- 2. All methods of piecing and other techniques (traditional piecing, foundation paper piecing, applique) except art, recycled/upcycled, tied, puff/yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted, English paper-pieced and whole-cloth quilts. Enter these in Division 625.
- 3. Machine or computerized quilting: Machine: domestic or longarm/sit-down-free motion. Computerized: quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the QMatic, Statler Stitcher, ProStitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
- 4. Hand quilting: using a needle and thread to sew a running stitch by hand across the entire area to be quilted.
- 5. Enter group quilts in Division 624.

DIVISION 623 - QUILT PIECED BY ENTRANT AND QUILTED BY ANOTHER QUILTER

RULE:

- 1. Pieced by the entrant and quilted by another individual, either professional or amateur. Includes quilts made from kits, purchased patterns and workshops.
- 2. All methods of piecing and other techniques (traditional piecing, foundation paper piecing, applique) except art, recycled/upcycled, tied, puff/yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted, English paper-pieced and whole-cloth quilts. Enter these in Division 625.
- 3. Machine or computerized quilting: Machine: domestic or longarm/sit-down-free motion. Computerized: quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the QMatic, Statler Stitcher, ProStitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
- 4. Hand quilting: using a needle and thread to sew a running stitch by hand across the entire area to be quilted.
- 5. Specify name of quilter on entry form.
- 6. Enter group quilts in Division 624.

CLASSES:


- 1. Machine and/or computerized >90" Wide
- 2. Machine and/or computerized 72 to 89" Wide
- 3. Machine and/or computerized 64 to 71" Wide
- 4. Machine and/or computerized Up to 63" Wide
- 5. Hand quilted Any Size

DIVISION 624 - GROUP QUILTS

RULES:

- 1. Quilt made by three (3) or more people. All methods of piecing and other techniques (traditional piecing, foundation paper piecing, applique) except art, recycled/upcycled, tied, puff/yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted, English paper-pieced and whole-cloth quilts. Enter those in Division 625.
- 2. Machine or computerized quilting: Machine: domestic or longarm/sit-down-free motion. Computerized: quilting pattern guided by a computer, such as the QMatic, Statler Stitcher, ProStitcher or IntelliQuilt systems.
- 3. Any adult quilting group may enter this class such as **friendship**, **round robin** or **opportunity** quilts.
- 4. Groups which include youths must enter the Youth Exhibits Department.

- 1. Machine and/or computerized >90" Wide
- 2. Machine and/or computerized <90" Wide
- 3. 100% Machine quilted Any Size



DIVISION 625 - QUILTS MADE USING SPECIAL TECHNIQUES/MATERIALS

RULES:

- 1. All entries must be entirely completed by one individual entrant, including quilting.
- 2. Art quilts experiment with textile manipulation, color, texture and/or a diversity of mixed media. Original art quilts (Class 1) are an original exploration of a concept or idea rather than following a design or pattern. Enter all other art quilts in Class 2.
- 3. Enter appliqued quilts (raw edge, needle turn, wool) in Divisions 620, 621, 622, or 623 as appropriate.

CLASS:

- 1. Original Art Quilt any size.
- 2. Art Quilt any size.
- 3. Whole cloth any size.
- 4. Tied quilting any size.
- 5. English Paper-pieced any size.
- 6. Other: puff, yo-yo, cathedral window, recycled/upcycled, crazy, heavily embroidered/embellished, painted.

<u>DIVISION 626 – QUILT CHALLENGE GROUPS</u>

RULES:

- 1. This division is open to groups of six (6) or more individuals. Groups with fewer than six entrants will be displayed but not judged.
- 2. Each individual must enter separately and specify the group name under entry description.
- 3. Each group must submit a display board no larger than 9" x 12" explaining the challenge when entries are received. Each entry must meet the challenge criteria as explained on the display board.
- 4. Round robin, friendship, and group quilts must be entered in Division 624.
- 5. Quilts quilted by a second person are permitted in this division. Include the name of the quilter on the entry form.
- 6. Any quilting method is accepted (computerized, machine, hand or tied).
- 7. Size limited to 45" wide for one of each guild's challenges.

NEEDLEWORK

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 630 - 633

1st Place \$30 Rosette 2nd Place Ribbon 3rd Place Ribbon

RULES:

- 1. All entries submitted as wall hangings must have a hanging wire on the back.
- 2. Sets may be entered only in the classes which specify sets permitted.
- 3. Machine embroidered items must be entered in Division 640.
- 4. 3-D/Figural refers to the needlework piece, not the mounting/display.

DIVISION 630 - NEEDLEPOINT

CLASS:

- 1. Wall hanging, framed or unframed any size
- 2. Pillow or 3-D/Figural/free-standing piece (box, figure, ornament etc.)
- 3. Other specify

DIVISION 631 - CROSS STITCH & COUNTED THREAD WORK

RULE:

Other counted threadwork = Hardanger, Assisi, Drawn/Pulled Work, Blackwork, etc.

CLASS:

- 1. Wall-hanging, counted cross stitch, framed or unframed any size.
- 2. Wall-hanging, other counted threadwork/combined techniques, framed or unframed any size.
- 3. Article, other counted threadwork/combined techniques.

DIVISION 632 - SURFACE EMBROIDERY (Not Counted)

CLASS:

- 1. Wall hanging framed or unframed any size.
- 2. Other techniques (pillow, 3D Figural/fee standing, stamped items, temari, stumpwork, silk, goldwork, etc.) specify. Enter items with combined techniques here.

DIVISION 633 - SMOCKING

RULE:

A Wee Care Gown is a simple sewn and smocked gown.

- 1. Smocked Garment (e.g., Adult or Child Dress, Blouse, Pants, etc.
- 2. Smocked Wee Care Gown
- 3. Smocked Blingy/Shiny Ornament Cable Car Cabler Challenge
- 4. Smocked Pendant single flag.
- 5. Other Smocked Item (Smocked Sampler, Purse, Bag, Name tag, etc.)

ARTS & CRAFTS

AWARDS OFFERED DIVISIONS 640 - 642

1st Place \$30 Rosette 2nd Place Ribbon 3rd Place Ribbon

RULES:

- 1. All paintings, non-fiber jewelry, ceramics/pottery, and stained glass must be entered in the Fine Arts Department.
- 2. All woodworking must be entered in the Department of Innovation.
- 3. All quilts must be entered in the Quilting Section.
- 4. Framed items must have a hanging wire.

DIVISION 640 - EMBELLISHED ITEM

The entry will be judged on the design and skill with which the exhibitor used the technique(s) to embellish the ready-made piece.

CLASS:

- 1. Non-wearable item embellished with paint, stitchery, beadwork or a combination of techniques.
- 2. Wearable item embellished with paint, stitchery, beadwork or a combination of techniques.
- 3. Machine embroidery on ready-made or item made by entrant.

DIVISION 641 - PAPER CRAFTS

RULES:

- 1. All framed entries must have hanging wire on back.
- 2. Size is limited to 14x17x16" high.

CLASS:

- 1. Scrapbooking provide two attached consecutive pages.
- 2. Single stationery item, stamped/embossed/embellished, etc. NO sets.
- 3. Other paper craft specify.

DIVISION 642 - OTHER CRAFTS

RULES:

- 1. Non-fiber jewelry, ceramics/pottery, and stained glass must be entered in the Fine Arts Galleria Department.
- 2. Woodworking must be entered in Department of Innovation.
- 3. Paintings must be entered in Fine Arts Galleria Department.
- 4. Sewn items/Needlework must be entered in Div. 600/601 or Div. 630-633.
- 5. Miniature Fairy Houses must be an original, home-made design securely mounted on a 12" or smaller base. Height (including base) cannot exceed 17".
- 6. Fiber-based jewelry must be securely attached to a display board.
- 7. Sets (separate coordinating items) must be securely attached to one another with a string or on a board.
- 8. Embellished purchased items must be entered in Division 640.

CLASS:

- 1. Cultural craft traditional crafts associated with a particular culture mask, dream catcher, origami, tool, garment, etc. Include a 3" x 5" card with brief description.
- 2. Woven Baskets
- 3. Miniature/Doll House
- 4. Miniature Fairy House
- 5. Other craft specify. Includes items such as: felted items, mosaics, fiber-based jewelry, etc.
